# SPECIAL SHOUT OUT


We are incredibly proud of Mrs Walton and Miss Tyrer who ran the Manchester Marathon last weekend!

The chatbot, which the developers claim users can form an actual emotional connection with, can be a source of comfort and expression for teenage users, however, there are some potential issues that parents should be aware of. Unlike a human friend, Replika can't offer real-world advice or handle complex emotions.

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### Adverse Childhood Experiences

Adverse Childhood Experiences, or ACEs, are stressful or traumatic events that happen during childhood, such as abuse, neglect, or family difficulties. These experiences can affect a child's mental and physical health, learning, and behaviour. At school, we work to create a safe and supportive environment to help every child thrive. 
# CHARACTER CURRICULUM


