


MASEFIELD NEWSLETTER

MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

Medical appointments should be made outside of school hours where possible. Where it is not possible, you must notify the office in advance. Taking your child out of school is disruptive for the class and impacts your child's learning and attendance.

If there are concerns about how much time your child is missing, proof of medical appointments will be required.

TERM TIME

Holidays must not be taken during term time as this has an extremely detrimental effect on your child's education. A fixed penalty notice is the least of the costs; it is the impact on your child's future educational success that presents the greatest cost.

We urge you to prioritise the long term benefits of regular school attendance over the short term impact of a holiday.

TOP TIPS

FOR YOU AND YOUR CHILD

ONLINE SAFETY



This week's free online safety guide, provided by the National College, focuses on TikTok. TikTok is a hugely popular video-sharing app where users watch and create short videos set to music, trends or challenges. Although engaging, TikTok can expose younger children to inappropriate language, risky trends, and content not suitable for their age. The "For You" feed uses algorithms that quickly push new videos to children, making it easy for them to view material they weren't looking for. TikTok also includes features like comments, direct messages, and live streams, which can increase the risk of contact from strangers.

What parents can do:
Enable Family Pairing to link your account with your child's, allowing you to manage screen time, content filters and privacy settings. Make sure your child's profile is set to private, limit who can comment on their videos, and regularly review what they're watching. Talk to your child about ignoring pressure to join in with trends and reporting anything that makes them feel unsure or uncomfortable.

SAFEGUARDING



Safe Walking to and From School

As children gain independence, it's important they know how to keep themselves safe on their journey to and from school.

Here are some simple safety reminders for families to practise together:

- Stick to safe routes encourage children to use well-lit, familiar paths and avoid shortcuts through isolated areas.
- Walk with a friend where possible, walking with a sibling or friend increases safety and confidence.
- Stay aware remind children to keep headphones low, avoid looking at phones while crossing roads, and always pay attention to traffic.
- Check in agree a routine, such as sending a quick message when they set off or arrive home.
