MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

Medical appointments should be made outside of school hours where possible. Where it is not possible, you must notify the office in advance. Taking your child out of school is disruptive for the class and impacts your child's learning and attendance.

If there are concerns about how much time your child is missing, proof of medical appointments will be required.

TERM TIME

Holidays must not be taken during term time as this has an extremely detrimental effect on your child's education. A fixed penalty notice is the least of the costs; it is the impact on your child's future educational success that presents the greatest cost.

We urge you to prioritise the long term benefits of regular school attendance over the short term impact of a holiday.

ONLINE SAFETY



This week's free online safety guide, provided by the National College, focuses on Roblox.

Roblox is an online platform that allows users to create, share and play games designed by other players. It's hugely popular with children, offering a wide variety of imaginative worlds to explore. However, because players can interact with others online, there are potential risks such as chatting with strangers, inappropriate user-created content, and in-game purchases that can quickly add up.

What parents can do:

Make use of Roblox's parental controls to restrict chat features, limit spending, and review which games your child can access. Encourage your child to tell you if another player makes them feel uncomfortable and remind them never to share personal information online. Regularly checking their friend list and in-game messages can also help ensure they're playing safely.

SAFEGUARDING



Stranger Awareness

It's important that children understand how to stay safe around people they don't know. While most people are kind and trustworthy, children should know what to do if a stranger approaches them.

Here are some simple tips to share at home:

Keep your distance – remind children not to go anywhere with someone they don't know, even if they offer treats or ask for help

help.

<u>Trust your feelings</u> – if something doesn't feel right, it's okay to walk away and tell a

trusted adult straight away.

Know safe adults – help your child identify trusted adults they can turn to if they need help, such as teachers, police officers, or shop workers.
