

MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

Medical appointments should be made outside of school hours where possible. Where it is not possible, you must notify the office in advance. Taking your child out of school is disruptive for the class and impacts your child's learning and attendance.

If there are concerns about how much time your child is missing, proof of medical appointments will be required.

TERM TIME HOLIDAYS

Holidays must not be taken düring term time as this has an extremely detrimental effect on your child's education. A fixed penalty notice is the least of the costs; it is the impact on your child's future educational success that presents the greatest cost.

We urge you to prioritise the long term benefits of requiar school attendance over the short term impact of a holiday.

ONLINE SAFET



This week's free online safety quide, provided by the National College, focuses on 'Roblox'. Roblox is an online game creator system where the majority of the content is created by "amateur" game creators in Roblox studio. These game makers are able to create and publish games to the community using simple tools, which can then be played by children worldwide, often online together, through a phone or tablet application or a web browser. Due to this, PEGI has altered their rating from PEGI 7 to 'Parental Guidance.

SAFEGUARDING



Understanding Anxiety

Anxiety is a feeling of worry or fear that can affect a child's thoughts, emotions, and body. It becomes concerning when a child feels overwhelmed or unable to cope. Signs may include changes in behaviour, becoming withdrawn, new worries, or a loss of appetite. To support your child, try calming techniques like deep breathing or grounding exercises, offer reassurance, and encourage them to think of a safe place or trusted person. Talking openly can also help. For further advice, visit Young Minds, the mental health charity for children and young people. Working together keeps our children safe and supported.
