
HIGHLIGHTS

MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

Medical appointments should be made outside of school hours where possible. Where it is not possible, you must notify the office in advance. Taking your child out of school is disruptive for the class and impacts your child's learning and attendance.

If there are concerns about how much time your child is missing, proof of medical appointments will be required.

TERM TIME HOLIDAYS

Holidays must not be taken düring term time as this has an extremely detrimental effect on your child's education. A fixed penalty notice is the least of the costs; it is the impact on your child's future educational success that presents the greatest cost.

We urge you to prioritise the long term benefits of requiar school attendance over the short term impact of a holiday.

TOP TIPS

FOR YOU AND YOUR CHILD

ONLINE SAFETY



This week's free online safety guide, provided by the National College, focuses on Snapchat. Snapchat is a messaging app where photos and videos are designed to disappear after being viewed. Its playful filters and "Snapstreaks" make it appealing to children, but the disappearing messages can give a false sense of security. Risks include contact from strangers, pressure to maintain streaks, sharing images without thinking, and location sharing through the Snap Map feature, which can reveal where a child is in real time.

What parents can do:

If your child uses Snapchat, ensure Snap Map is set to Ghost Mode so their location is hidden. Encourage them only to connect with people they know in real life and explain that screenshots or third-party apps can save messages — meaning snaps aren't truly temporary. Regular conversations about respectful behaviour, safe sharing, and what to do if someone makes them feel uncomfortable can help children develop good digital habits.

SAFEGUARDING



Safe Playdates and Visiting Other Homes

As children spend more time with friends outside school, it's important that parents feel confident about their safety when visiting other homes.

Helpful things for families to consider include:
 Share key information – let the other parent know about any allergies, medical needs, or worries your child may have.
 Check supervision – it's okay to ask who

 Check supervision – it's okay to ask who will be at home and whether an adult will be present throughout the visit.

 Set clear boundaries – talk to your child about what to do if they feel uncomfortable, and agree simple rules such as staying in communal areas and not going online without permission.

Keep communication open – make sure your child knows they can always call home if they need you.

For more guidance, the NSPCC provides clear advice on building children's confidence and keeping them safe in different settings.
