#### MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

Medical appointments should be made outside of school hours where possible. Where it is not possible, you must notify the office in advance. Taking your child out of school is disruptive for the class and impacts your child's learning and attendance.

If there are concerns about how much time your child is missing, proof of medical appointments will be required.

## TERM TIME

Holidays must not be taken during term time as this has an extremely detrimental effect on your child's education. A fixed penalty notice is the least of the costs; it is the impact on your child's future educational success that presents the greatest cost.

We urge you to prioritise the long term benefits of regular school attendance over the short term impact of a holiday.

# TOP TIPS

### ONLINE SAFETY



This week's free online safety guide, provided by the National College, focuses on YouTube Shorts.

YouTube Shorts is a feature within YouTube that allows users to create and watch short, vertical videos lasting up to 60 seconds. These quick, catchy clips often appear one after another — encouraging endless scrolling.

While many Shorts are harmless and entertaining, some can contain inappropriate language, music, or themes that aren't suitable for younger viewers. The "auto-play" design also means children can quickly be exposed to unsuitable content without realising.

What parents can do:
Ensure your child is using YouTube Kids instead of the main YouTube app, set up restricted mode, and regularly review their watch history. Talking to your child about what they watch and encouraging them to tell you if something makes them uncomfortable are also key ways to keep them safe online.

### SAFEGUARDING



#### Online Safety: Sharing Photos and Videos

With so many apps making it easy to share photos and videos, it's important to remind children — and adults — to think before they post. Once something is shared online, it can be copied, saved or spread very

quickly.

Here are a few simple tips to help keep children safe:

·Check privacy settings – make sure your child's accounts are set to private so only friends and family can see what they share.

•Think before posting – talk to your child about not sharing personal information such as school uniforms, addresses, or locations in pictures.

·Ask permission – encourage children to always ask before sharing photos of friends or family.
