A huge congratulations to our Y6 Scholars who have all completed the scholars programme with the Brilliant Club.




They were presented with their awards at the University of Manchester.

Holidays in Term Time

Holidays must not be taken during term time as this has an extremely detrimental effect on your child's education.

The long-term cost to your child's education of going on holiday in term time, far outweighs the short term gain of the holiday at the time. The £60 fixed penalty notice is the least of the costs; it is the impact on your child's future educational success that presents the greatest cost. Children miss vital learning that cannot be repeated. It is widely acknowledged that mental health and personal well-being flourish when children have good routines and engage with their learning. Holidays in term time are disruptive on both counts. I urge you to prioritise the long-term benefits of regular school attendance, over the short term impact of a holiday in term time.

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Online Safety Tip

Welcome to our 'Online Safety Tip Of The Week'. On each newsletter, we will provide you with some useful hints, tips, guides and fact sheets from the National Online Safety (NOS) website that you as parents and carers will be able to use to help keep your child safe whilst online.

This week's free online safety guide focuses on 'Roblox'. Roblox is an online game creator system where the majority of the content is created by "amateur" game creators in Roblox studio. These game makers are able to create and publish games to the community using simple tools, which can then be played by children worldwide, often online together, through a phone or tablet application or a web browser. Due to this, PEGI has altered their rating from PEGI 7 to 'Parental Guidance Recommended' because of the amount of user-generated content.

Safeguarding Tip

Top tips for keeping your children safe in the car and when you're out and about UK law requires that all children travelling in cars use the correct child restraints until they reach 12 years old or 135cm in height, whichever comes first. In the UK, it is illegal to drive or travel in a car without a properly fastened seat belt.

As the driver of a car, you are legally responsible for making sure that any passenger under 14 years old is using an appropriate child restraint or an adult seatbelt. Activate the child safety locks on your car doors to prevent children from opening the doors while the car is moving or standing still. Never leave children unattended in a car even for a minute. Even if you're only planning on being out of the car for a few minutes a variety of dangers or hazards might arise.

Sustainability Top Tip

Think twice before shopping "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle" may feel retro, but it's just as important today as when the phrase was first coined. Every product we purchase has an environmental footprint, from the materials used to create it to the pollution emitted during manufacturing to the packaging that ends up in landfills. So before you buy, ask yourself if you really need it. If you do, consider buying gently used instead of new, and look for minimal packaging and shipping.









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
