

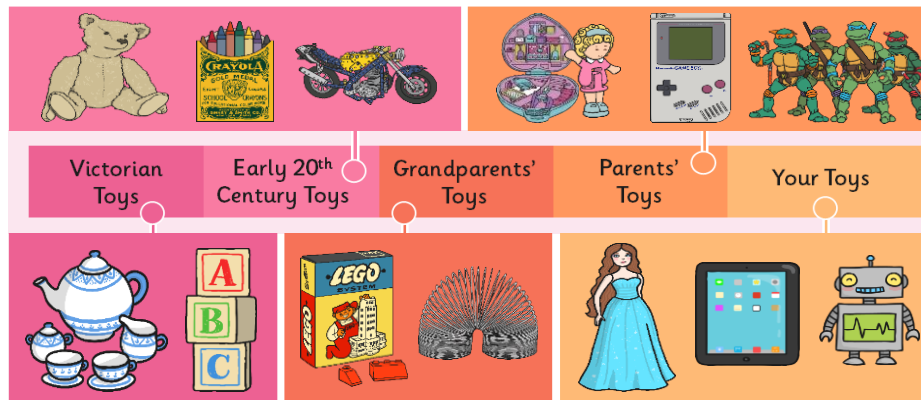

Key Knowledge

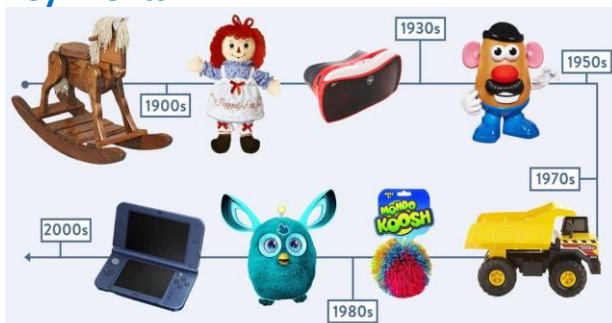
- ✓ Old toys were often made out of wood
- ✓ Modern toys are mainly made of plastic
- ✓ Old toys were moved by hand or mechanical
- ✓ Modern toys often use batteries or an electronic
- ✓ In Victorian times, toys were mainly made of wood, paper and metal.
- ✓ Chalk was used by teachers in the classroom
- ✓ Toys have changed from our grandparents' childhoods.
- ✓ There are many similarities and differences between old and new toys - this can be down to how they move and what they are made from.

Difference (Past Vs Present)

Old toys were often made out of wood 	Modern (new) toys are often made out of plastic
Old toys were mechanical or moved by hand 	Modern toys often use batteries
Old toys were often made by hand 	Modern (new) toys are usually made by machines

wooden toys: Lots of toys were made of wood. Boats, train sets and cup and ball were all made of wood. Some toys are still made of wood.

Paper toys: Some toys, like paper windmills, were made out of paper

Metal toys: Toy soldiers and some spinning tops were made out of metal.

Plastic toys: Most modern toys are made of plastic. Toy soldiers, dolls and ride-on cars are usually made of plastic.

Modern: Things made now or recently.
