KS1 pupils have enjoyed a range of engaging enrichment activities designed to support learning beyond the classroom. These sessions have helped to develop confidence, teamwork and key skills in a fun and supportive environment.

During enrichment, children took part in number skills activities using Fluency Bee, which helped to strengthen number recognition, counting and simple calculations. Phonics activities supported early reading skills through games and interactive tasks, encouraging children to practise sounds and blending in an enjoyable way. Pupils also participated in PE sessions with Coach Beth, focusing on physical development, coordination and teamwork through structured sporting activities.

#### What Went Well

- Pupils showed high levels of engagement and enthusiasm, particularly during Fluency Bee number challenges and PE sessions.
- Children worked well together, developing confidence and resilience while practising phonics and physical skills.

#### Next Steps:

- Continue to provide regular enrichment opportunities to embed number and phonics skills further.
- Introduce small-group challenges to support children who need additional practice while extending those who are ready for more complex tasks.
