

Its colourful user interface is designed with young people in mind and it offers a curated, family-friendly experience with features like agebased content settings and parental controls. It aims to create a safer digital space where children can explore and enjoy content independently, while giving parents tools to guide and monitor their viewing habits.

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Sleep Habits

This week, we're highlighting how vital sleep is for children's wellbeing and development. Good-quality sleep boosts learning, memory, attention and emotional resilience—skills that are essential both in and out of the classroom.
