COVER



Cover up the word so you cannot see it.
Picture the word in your mind.

WRITE



Write down the word,
remembering how it sounds
and what it looks like.

CHECK



Check to see if it is correct.
Tick the letters you got correct.
Write the word correctly if you made any mistakes.

The following table is a list of sounds, rules and spellings your child will be learning this year and some examples of words you may want to practise.

Sound or Spelling Rule	Examples of words
The sound spelt ge and dge	badge, edge, bridge, village, huge.
The sound /s/ spelt c before e, l and y.	race, ice, cell, lace, pace.
The sound spelt kn and gn	knit, knob, knock, gnat, gnaw.
The sound spelt wr	write, wrote, written, wrestle, wrist.
The sound spelt -le	table, apple, bottle, little, middle.
The sound spelt -el	angel, wheel, level, model, label.
The sound spelt -al	metal, pedal, capital, hospital, animal.
The sound spelt -il	pencil, fossil, nostril, basil, peril.
The sound spelt -y	cry, fly, dry, try, reply.
The sound spelt -es	babies, diaries, copies, carries, tries.
Adding -ed, -ing, -er and -est	copied, copier, happier, happiest, cried.
The sound spelt a	ball, call, fall, wall, talk.
The sound spelt o	mother, other, brother, nothing, Monday.
The sound spelt -ey	key, donkey, monkey, valley, chimney.
The sound a after a w and qu	want, watch, wander, what, wash.
The sound spelt or after w	word, work, worm, world, worth.
The sound spelt ar after w	war, warmth, warm, towards, warble.
The suffixes -ment, -ness, -ful, -less and -ly	enjoyment, payment, movement, sadness, happiness.
Contractions	can't, haven't, didn't, couldn't, wouldn't, shouldn't, it's, I'm, you're, you'll, he'll, doesn't
Words ending in -tion	station, fiction, motion, national, section, action
