## Message from Mr Done

We have come to the end of a busy half term and I am sure everyone is ready for some rest and relaxation. It has been a remarkable term – I am so proud of every single child for their hard work, resilience and love of learning. On another pleasing note, school received information about the performance of their Y6 class in the summer compared to schools nationally. We were delighted to find out that our pupils results in Reading, Writing & Maths combined was in the top 6% of schools nationally. Progress in Reading was in the top 2%, writing progress in the top 5% and Maths progress in the top 8% of schools nationally. These results are amazing! They reflect the hard work of children, partnerships with parents and the huge effort of all staff to provide impactful teaching to pupils.

#### **Attendance Update**

Our 97% target is still achievable this year if we all work together on ensuring children are in school EVERY day and not missing any learning.

Our attendance for the week is 94.76%

Our attendance for the year to date is 95.55%



## **Appointments**

We ask that medical appointments are made outside of school hours where possible.

Where it is not possible to avoid this in school time you must notify the office beforehand.

Taking your child out in school time not only disrupts the class but also impacts their learning and attendance.

If there are concerns regarding the amount of time your child is missing then proof of all future appointments will be requested.



#### **Holidays in Term Time**

Holidays must not be taken during term time as this has an extremely detrimental effect on your child's education.

The long-term cost to your child's education of going on holiday in term time, far outweighs the short term gain of the holiday at the time. The £60 fixed penalty notice is the least of the costs; it is the impact on your child's future educational success that presents the greatest cost. Children miss vital learning that cannot be repeated. It is widely acknowledged that mental health and personal well-being flourish when children have good routines and engage with their learning. Holidays in term time are disruptive on both counts. I urge you to prioritise the long-term benefits of regular school attendance, over the short term impact of a holiday in term time.

This week's free online safety guide, provided by the National Online Safety (NOS) website, focuses on Tik

Tok. The popular video-sharing social media app allows users to create, view and download looping 15-second clips. Typically, these are videos of users lip-syncing and dancing to popular songs enhanced with filters, effects and text. Designed with young people in mind (but carrying an age rating of 13<sup>+</sup>), Tik Tok skyrocketed in popularity in 2019 and now boasts approximately a billion users worldwide.

## Physical Abuse

Keeping Children Safe in Education 2023 categorises four main types of abuse: these are physical, emotional, sexual and neglect. Physical abuse is when someone hurts or harms a child or young person on purpose. It can include hitting, shaking, throwing. Physical harm may also be caused when a parent fabricates or induces symptoms of illness in a child. Chastisement can also be classed as physical abuse when excessive force is used. 


